## Ways to use Dialoque

At the beginning of a sentence: "Expel the object!" Freak shouts. (27)

In the middle of a sentence: to himself. (18)

In a broke<u>n quote:</u> "Hey, Gwen," one of the beards says, "can't you give this kid a pill or something?" (8)

## Rules for Using Dialogue

- 1. For every new speaker, begin a new line.
- 2. Commas and periods go inside quotation marks
- 3. Use commas to separate dialogue tags (except when using ! or ?)
- 4. Capitalize the first letter of spoken dialogue
- 5. Indent new lines
- 6. Dialogue should always drive the plot!
